



## **ROTORUA T10 CRICKET TOURNAMENT - INFORMATION**

### **LABOUR WEEKEND – SAT 21 and SUN 22 OCTOBER 2017**

#### **OVERVIEW**

The tournament targets the semi-serious adult cricketer player in a fun quick fire T10 (ten over) cricket tournament at the start of the season. Played over 2 days, with a minimum of 5 games per team, the tournament provides the ideal opportunity for getting some cricket under your belt and socialising

#### **TOURNAMENT FORMAT**

The tournament format is broadly based on the Rugby 7's format, with 16 teams being drawn at random into 4 pools of 4 teams. The round robin phase in each pool is played on Saturday with points awarded for wins, ties and losses. Pool standings then determine the knockout phase groupings, with the knockout phase being played on Sunday. The first 2 teams in each pool progress to the Cup and Plate competition and the third and fourth teams into the Bowl and Shield competition.

The team winning each of the 4 competitions will receive a cash prize of \$200. Other prizes may be added depending on sponsorship support

#### **RULES SUMMARY**

- Laws of Cricket apply as amended to suit a T10 match format. Full set of rules will be provided one week before the tournament. A summary of the main rules modifications / playing conditions are below



- Innings - Each innings shall consist of a maximum of 10, 6 ball overs.
- Players
  - 8 batsmen are used, however 10 fielders are allowed, however only 8 fielders are permitted on the field at one time.
  - Fielding restrictions are a maximum of 4 fielders on the leg side
- Bowling.
  - Maximum of 6 balls over except for the last over where 6 legitimate balls are to be bowled.
  - 2 overs maximum per player.
  - Penalty ball - All wides and no balls are penalty balls which result in 2 extra runs for the team total. Free hit after a no ball
  - Maximum run up length is 6 paces
- Batting.
  - Retire at 30, however batsman can return to bat should all other wickets fallen
  - Last man standing rule which means that 8 wickets need to be taken to “bowl out” a team .
  - Double runs are scored for all boundaries in the last over
- Matches will be played on artificial grass pitches in Rotorua.
- Games shall be played with the supplied 156g white Kookaburra ball. There shall be one ball per game and the team fielding first gets first use of the new ball, except the finals where each team shall receive a new ball
- Umpires. Teams to umpire their own games, except for finals where an independent umpire will be provided by Rotorua Cricket
- Teams to provide their own equipment including protective equipment and stumps
- Players shall comply with Rotorua Cricket Associations Player Safety Regulations. Teams with players not complying may be disqualified by the Tournament Director

- Alcohol. Players are not permitted to drink alcohol during or between games. There is plenty of opportunity at the end of each day to drink alcohol. Teams with players not complying may be disqualified by the Tournament Director

The first 16 teams entries that are received, with correctly filled out entry forms, will be advised that their entries have been accepted and they will have until Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2017 pay the full entry fee (as noted on the entry form) into the Rotorua Cricket bank account. If the tournament fee is not received for any team, in full, by the required date, that team’s entry will be forfeit and a replacement team’s entry will be accepted.
